

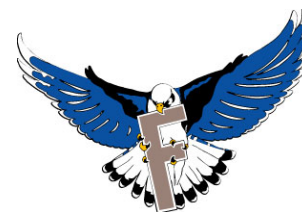

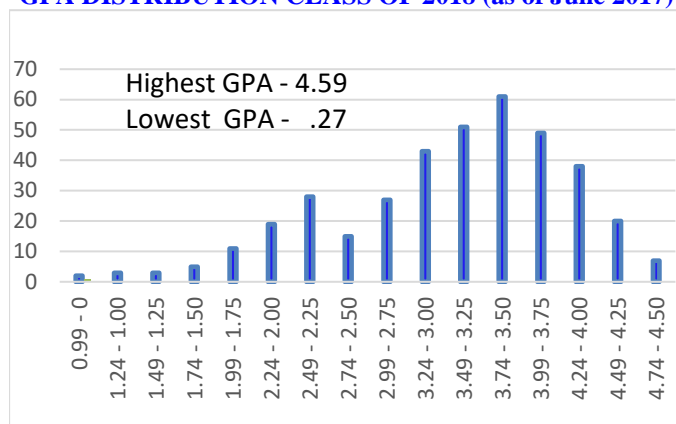


## TOWN OF FAIRFIELD

#### SUBJECT LEVEL GROUPING

Students are homogeneously grouped in English, mathematics, science, U.S. History and world languages\* based on test scores, past achievement, teacher and counselor recommendation.

**Advanced Placement:** College level courses.

**Level 1:** Honors courses: second digit of course number is designated a 1 (e.g. 31).

**Level 0:** All courses heterogeneously grouped: second digit of course number is designated a 0 (e.g. 10).

**Level 2:** Rigorous college preparatory courses: second digit of course number is designated a 2 (e.g. 32).

\* Spanish 61 and French 61 are not offered. Students take a 60 level or AP.
