Dates to Remember:

Reader's Workshop:

In Reader's Workshop we will continue our character study. We'll talk about main characters this week and focus on how the characters feel, what they do, and what they say in a book, in order to learn more about them.

Writer's Workshop:

Last week we focused on ending punctuation. We learned about the importance of periods, exclamation points, and question marks, and how they help us end a sentence and stop our voices. This week we'll focus on using comparisons in our pieces.

Math:

- * This week in Math we will continue our study of geometry and learn all about 3D shapes: cone, pyramid, rectangular prism, cube, sphere, and cylinder. We'll talk about the flat surfaces (faces) and vertices (points), and edges of these shapes.
- * A letter is coming home this Monday outlining a special geometry project due back to school by Friday, February 5th. Students are being asked to create a sculpture **at home**, using 3D objects (cone, sphere, pyramid, cube, cylinder, rectangular prism). Students can use any combination of these 3D solid figures, and do not have to use all of them. We want students to be creative with items they can reuse, recycle, or repurpose from home. Please do not go out and purchase anything special for this project. For example, a city scene of skyscrapers made from various boxes (rectangular prisms) or a rocket ship made from an oatmeal container and paper towel tubes (cylinders) are examples of what students can do. This should be a fun extension of our study of geometry in the classroom!

Word Work:

Our new Word Wall Words are: best, came, make, of, said.

* This week we will focus on "magic e" words. For example, a says its name in the word make because of the silent e found at the end of the word.

Science/Social Studies:

We've been talking about the characteristics of different habitats and what animals need to have/do to survive there.

Odds and Ends:

* Now that it's snow boot season, please help your child remember that we have P.E. on "B" days and "E" days, and all students need to wear sneakers. Students can bring in their sneakers and change before we go to P.E.
