
# 1L's Weekly News - Week of April 4th

## Reader's Workshop:

## Writer's Workshop:

In Writer's Workshop we will talk about what makes realistic fiction realistic. We'll also discuss ways to *show* feelings in our stories instead of just *tell* about them. For example instead of saying, "Nate was happy," a writer can say, "Nate had a big smile on his face!"

### Math:

We'll continue our measurement unit in math. We've been practicing making reasonable estimates and then measuring objects using non-standard units. We'll focus on measuring ourselves this week!
