- In writing we are exploring mentor texts and identifying what makes their writing powerful so that we can try out their "craft moves" in our own narratives.

- In math, we continue with our place value unit. We are learning that numbers can be composed and decomposed for computation. Children who are solid on the basic facts can use their 5 minutes of nightly practice for more challenging computation (ie: You have 63, I give you 3 groups of ten, what do you have now? You have 44, I give you 3 ones, what do you have now? In order to be proficient at mental math with two-digit numbers, your child will need to own the basic math facts. I know the 5 minute practice is easy to overlook, but encouraging your child to take it seriously will be a gift to them, for many years to come. (Ask any middle school math teacher!©)
- Last week we participated in five rock centers where we explored rock properties (size, luster, shape, texture, weight, color) in a variety of ways. Weather allowing, we'll be cracking open some rocks this week to explore what's inside!
- In **reading**, we've been focusing on *retelling*. Our goal is to be able to verbally retell a book, in sequence, and to include important details/evidence from the text. The components of a good retelling include: character (character's name, traits, text evidence of traits), setting, plot with transitions (ie: First, next, after that, then, finally), story language, and being able to identify the most important part.
