The Fairfield Public Schools Overdrive library is available to students in grades 6-12.

Overdrive offers 24/7 access to a curated collection of e-books and audio books. Read in your browser or download the OverDrive app on your tablet, device or phone.

From your browser:

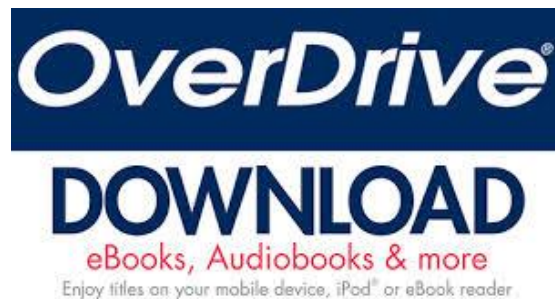
- Go to Overdrive.fairfieldschools.org.
- Select your middle school or high school.
- Enter your student ID number where it asks for library card #.
- Select your book. Choose to read in browser or to download to your device.

From Class Link:

- Go to Classlink.com.
- Log in with your network username, network password, and the code **Fairfield**.
- Click the OverDrive icon.
- Select your book. Choose to read in browser or to download to your device.

From the OverDrive App:

- Download the OverDrive App from your app store.
- Select "Under 13 years old or using OverDrive through your school?"
- Tap the menu on the top of the screen and select "Add a library."
- Follow the directions to select your school.
- Sign in by selecting your school and adding your student ID number.
- Select your book. Choose to read in browser or to download to your device.



What are the differences between eBook formats?

An eBook is a digital book that can be read on a computer or mobile device.

Here are the different eBook formats that may be available when you borrow an eBook from your school or library:

OVERDRIVE READ

- Read in your browser. No software or downloads are required to read OverDrive Read eBooks.
- Reading progress and bookmarks are stored in the cloud, so you can always pick up where you left off no matter what device you're on.
- Most eBooks automatically adjust to fit your screen, but some have a [fixed layout](#) (set by the publisher) to better display graphic-heavy eBooks.
- Some eBooks (called OverDrive Read-along eBooks) have [professional narration](#) accompanying them.

EPUB

- You can download and read all EPUB eBooks using [Adobe Digital Editions](#) (ADE) on a computer or [the OverDrive app](#) (for [Android](#), [Chromebook](#), [iOS](#), or [Windows 8 and up](#)).
- There are two types of EPUB eBooks: Adobe and Open EPUB.
 - Adobe EPUB
 - Adobe EPUB eBooks are protected by Adobe's digital rights management (DRM) system. These eBooks require you to authorize your computer or device before reading them. Learn more about [authorizing your computer](#) or [authorizing the OverDrive app](#).
 - Open EPUB
 - Open EPUB eBooks aren't protected by Adobe's DRM system. This means you don't need to authorize your computer or device before reading them.
 - Open EPUBs can be downloaded to any reading app of your choice (like iBooks or Play Books) in addition to the OverDrive app or Adobe Digital Editions.
- EPUB eBooks automatically adjust to fit screen and allow you to change display options- font size, # columns etc.

PDF

- You can download and read all PDF titles using [Adobe Digital Editions](#). Unlike EPUBs, PDFs are not compatible with the OverDrive app.
- There are two types of PDF titles: Adobe and Open PDF.
 - Adobe PDFs
 - Adobe PDFs are protected by Adobe's DRM system. These eBooks require you to authorize your computer before reading them. Learn more about [authorizing your computer](#).
 - Open PDFs
 - Open PDFs aren't protected by Adobe's DRM system. This means you don't need to authorize your computer before reading them.
 - Open PDFs can be opened in your device's web browser (like Chrome or Safari) or in another reading app (but not the OverDrive app).
- PDFs have a fixed layout, so they don't automatically adjust to fit your screen, and don't allow you to adjust display options like font size. However, you can zoom in on a page or graphic.
- PDFs are often used for graphic novels, illustrated eBooks, textbooks, and other titles with specific layouts.

KINDLE BOOKS: You can read Kindle Books on any Kindle device or Kindle reading app.

- Kindle Books are only available to borrow from U.S. libraries and schools.
- Work like any other Kindle bk from Amazon, but will expire at the end lending period like any library eBook.
