## **Student and Teacher Achievements**

- Rachel Keleher, Family and Consumer Science department liaison, reports that the Connecticut State Department of Education has recognized Fairfield Ludlowe High School as the #1 ranked Connecticut Secondary School in the Textiles and Design area of concentration. FCS teacher Donna Huber teaches textiles and design.
