## **Student and Teacher Achievements**

- **Music** Our amazing music teachers, Nick Albano, Lynda Smith, and Lauren Pine kicked off the month on October 5 with a fall concert and ended the month with the Orchestra Spooktacular on Halloween Eve.
- College & Career Center Alice Gorman has been working hard hosting 220 information sessions from colleges and universities. Collectively, the admission reps met with 1,072 students. The number of students attending each visit ranged from UCONN, which topped the charts at 55, to many smaller one-on-one meetings with just the student and the admission rep. On October 24, the CCC did a presentation on "How to Find Scholarships" with about 100 parents and students in attendance. The session was videotaped and is posted on the School Counseling website along with the PowerPoint and handouts provided.
