Student Progress

As we enter the second half of the first marking period, teachers have been updating student scores through Infinite Campus. Increased Security at Home Athletic Contests

Starting Friday, October 10, at our home football game, we will be instituting some new security and safety measures. A detail of security guards will be <u>inspecting all bags as fans enter the gates</u>, and <u>beverages will not be allowed into the stadium</u>. We encourage our fans to cheer loudly for our teams, but inappropriate or derogatory language will not be tolerated from our students, and we know we can count on parents to be good role models. Poor language or behavior choices could result in removal from the stadium. Police will also be monitoring the campus since no alcoholic beverages are allowed anywhere on school grounds (including parking lots) by anyone of any age. We have great sports teams this year and we want to honor their efforts and sportsmanship with a safe and spirited environment.

Also, on **Tuesday, October 21, 7-9 p.m.,** Mr. Bob Esposito (Director of Pupil Services and Counseling) will present "High School 101" in the auditorium. High School 101 provides parents of freshmen an overview of what they can expect in the coming four years and tips on navigating the high school experience.

National Drug and Alcohol Awareness Month and Distracted Driving Assembly

On Friday, October 10, we will be hosting an assembly for all juniors and seniors about <u>Distracted Driving</u> by the Save a Life Foundation during Period 2. This presentation addresses the very real and sometimes fatal consequences of poor choices that are made while driving distracted.

Also, the month of October is National Drug and Alcohol Awareness month, or "Red Ribbon Month." Over the course of the month, we will be hosting various prevention programs for our students relating to this topic as well as other risky behaviors. Teachers will have an opportunity to bring their classes to presentations where students can receive information and engage in conversation around many topics. Presenters include:

- Mothers Against Drunk Driving will be talking about how the media influences teens as well as short-and long-term effects of drinking;
- The Governor's Partnership will be presenting on the effects of drugs (including caffeine) on the brain;
- The Interactive Theater Group sends strong messages and informs about date rape, social media, and smart decision making;
- Chief Tracy of the Fairfield Fire Department will discussing Texting and Driving drawing from his experiences from many accident scenes;

We also address many of these topics throughout the year through various programs and curricula.

School Climate Survey Coming

The Fairfield Public Schools will once again be conducting its School Climate Survey for students, parents and staff. Students will be taking the survey at school and parents will be taking the survey through a link posted in Infinite Campus. All responses are completely confidential and we are urging all families to take part. The results will be used to drive reforms at FLHS and to celebrate areas of success.
