## FAIRFIELD LUDLOWE HIGH SCHOOL

Fairfield Ludlowe High School is a four-year comprehensive high school with a total enrollment of approximately 1,550 students. The school is divided into three houses, each consisting of a cross-section of students in grades $9-12$. The housemasters, deans, teachers and counselors work as a leadership team.

Courses are offered on a semester or yearly basis. Semester-long courses are awarded 1 credit upon successful completion. Year-long courses are awarded 2 credits upon successful completion.

Demonstrate Academic Proficiency on the CAPT Science test. Demonstrate computer proficiency.
CAPT is a statewide assessment administered to all public school students in grade ten. The CAPT includes an assessment in science. The statewide and system goals represent a demanding level of achievement. Fairfield Board of Education graduation policy requires students to be at the proficiency level on the science assessment of CAPT. For the Class of 2016, $96.8 \%$ of students scored at the proficiency level or higher on the science assessment as tenth graders in 2014. Legislation specifies that scores be sent with transcripts.

Some of our students participate in the following programs: The Center for Global Studies, Bridgeport Regional Vocational Aquaculture School and The Regional Center for the Arts.

## SUBJECT LEVEL GROUPING

Students are homogeneously grouped in English, mathematics, science, U.S. History and world languages* based on test scores, past achievement, teacher and counselor recommendation.

Level 0: All courses heterogeneously grouped: second digit of course number is designated a 0 (e.g. 10).

## AP SCORES

Fairfield Ludlowe High School offers 20 AP courses. AP Statistics, Microeconomics and Macroeconomics are the only AP courses available to sophomores. For the 2014-2015 school year, AP enrollment was 830 students. In May 2015, 341 students sat for 667 AP examinations. $88.8 \%$ of the scores were 3 or higher.
