- **Cheerleaders** - FLHS Cheerleaders had great performances at the FCIAC Championships. The girls placed 2nd in the Team Competition, placed 1st in the Partner Stunt. We also won Coaching Staff of the Year.
 - **Girls Ski Team**- Finished the regular season undefeated with a record of 22-0, earning them the L Division Regular Season Championship. They defeated Staples by 2.42 seconds to win the CONNECTICUT STATE CHAMPIONSHIP. This is their 6th Consecutive State Championship. This also capped an undefeated regular season finish at 23-0.
 - **Boys Ski Team**- Finished the regular season with a record of 21-4. This is their best record in 3 seasons. They also had a great day finishing 2nd in a field of 12 teams. This is their best finish since 2013.

Maye came in first place in the 55 meter dash. Tess finished first in the long jump. Other top results include a 3rd finish for the 4X800 team made up of Paige Davis, Lauren O’Neil, Keegan Simonsen, and Alyssa Kraus. A 3rd place finish for Alyssa Kraus in the 1000 meter run. Tess Stapleton and Nora Skoczen finished 2nd and 3rd in the 55 meter hurdles. They competed at the State Open Championships this past weekend. Tess Stapleton finished 1st place in the 55 hurdles. This meet includes all qualifiers from the entire state. This is an amazing accomplishment, especially for a freshmen.
