Dear Grade 11 Parent/Guardian,

Fairfield Ludlowe High School will be administering the PSAT/NMSQT to grade 11 students on **Wednesday, October 10**. There is no cost for students to take the PSAT/NMSQT and they will be automatically registered for the test. All students will receive the *PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide* in homeroom. Students are encouraged to review this material and use the practice full length test to help them understand the types of questions they will be asked.

It is important to understand that PSAT scores will not be sent to colleges. However, a small number of students may qualify for National Merit Scholarship recognition based upon their scores as eleventh graders. In addition, this test will be a preview for the SAT which will be administered to all grade 11 students on April 9, 2019 as the State of Connecticut student assessment of academic proficiency.

On October 10, all grade 11 students will report to the gym at 7:30 a.m. Students must come to school with **two #2 pencils, a graphing calculator and a picture ID**. Students will be dismissed from school at 11:45 a.m. No lunch will be served on this day.

Test results can be accessed by mid-December via the student's College Board account. Students will receive an email when their PSAT scores are available. Students should visit <https://www.collegeboard.org/> to create a College Board account, if needed. When creating an account, use the student's active personal email account.
