Dear Grade 9 Parent/Guardian,

PSAT 8/9 scores are now available on the College Board website. The PSAT 8/9 was the first of three practice assessments that students will take in preparation for the Connecticut School Day SAT that is administered during the spring of their junior year of high school. PSAT scores are not sent to colleges, nor do they count toward college admission. The desired purpose of the PSAT scores is to identify what your child is doing well, and what your child should work on to better prepare for the SAT.

To access scores, see the directions below on creating a College Board account or log-in to a pre-existing College Board account. Please remember this account must be created in your child's name, using your child's information, as they will need to access this account throughout their high school experience.

Create a College Board Account

To access your child's scores, click [here](#) to create a College Board account and fill in the requested information. It is important to use the same first and last name your child used for the PSAT when creating an account. Also, use the student's (not parent's) active personal email account. **Do not use the student's school e-mail address.**
