Dear Parents and Guardians of 9th Graders:

Our young people are at risk. Spend an evening with your student and lower that risk!

The latest student survey conducted by RYASAP tells us that our collaborative efforts to educate students about the dangers of underage drinking are beginning to make a difference. Students report a decrease in alcohol use by 9th graders, from 28% using in 2012 to 18% in 2014. We believe that one of the factors in this decrease is the 9th Grade Forum on Underage Drinking and Risky Behavior, an educational event co-sponsored with the FWHS PTA.

A committed group of parents and high school educators have worked together to plan this important event. The 9th Grade Forum on Underage Drinking and Risky Behavior, as an effort to provide parents and students with information that will address this serious problem in our community.
