2015- PSAT – THE NEW TEST

On Wednesday, October 14, 2015 all FWHS 10th and 11th graders will take the new PSAT in school. There is no cost and you do not need to register for the test. We will be posting a letter on our website and a schedule in the daily bulletin for all of our students. College Board no longer provides an opportunity for a Saturday administration of the PSAT.

School will be dismissed at 11:45. We will have the regular scheduled class for all grade 9-12 students in the morning from 7:30-8:11. This will be followed by the PSAT testing. Our 9th and 12th grade students will participate in different activities focused on their grade level. Seniors received information in Homeroom and there is a copy of this letter on our website.

During the week of September 28th all 10th and 11th graders will receive the Official Student Guide to the PSAT/NMSQT in homeroom. Please review this material and use the full length Practice Test to help you understand the types of questions and format of the test. Math and English teachers will be reviewing and discussing some of this information in classes over the next two weeks. We expect the results some time in December and they will be reviewed with students by the school counselors.

The 10th grade test is purely a practice and diagnostic tool- the results are not sent to colleges. It will provide information to help students and teachers prepare for future assessments. The 11th grade test is also a practice test that does not get sent to colleges; however, a small number of students may qualify for the National Merit Scholarship recognition based on their scores from this test.

In addition, this will be a preview for the NEW SAT which will be administered to all juniors in March in school replacing SBAC as the new State of Connecticut student assessment of academic proficiency.

 - You will now see the details for the college visit.

- ✓ **Print this page, which is your pass.**
- ✓ **Bring the pass to your teacher and ask them to sign it.**
- ✓ **Put your name on the pass and bring this to the College & Career Resource Center when you attend the information session.**
- ✓ Remember to sign the attendance sheet at the information session otherwise you will receive a cut from your class.
