Greetings FWHS Students and Parents:

We're sending along this brief newsletter to provide you with some important information to assure a smooth start to the 2014-15 school year.

Please note that the first day for 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students will be on Thursday August 28th. 9th graders are especially lucky; they will start with an orientation day on August 27th. On the 28th all students will begin the day in homeroom where final schedules, lockers, and handbooks will be distributed. We will also meet with each class during the first two days of school to introduce important people, to make students aware of key policies and procedures, and to provide some insight into ways to help assure a successful school year.

Our expectation for everyone in the Fairfield Warde High School community is that each person feels valued, safe, respected, and challenged to be the best he or she can be. Therefore, for everyone's benefit, we ask that you pay particular attention to the following:

Cell Phones Our goal in the 2014-15 school year is to foster a learning environment that is free of disruption while permitting the responsible and constructive use of modern technology such as cell phones and smart phones. Key aspects of the policy will be reviewed with the students when school begins. Please note that photographic and recording functions of phones may only be used with the expressed permission of a teacher or administrator.

FWHS Campus and School Grounds Regulations We want our students to take full advantage of the many resources for learning here at FWHS and to remain safe throughout the school day. These are the major reasons we have a "closed campus." Students are not permitted to leave school grounds or to be in any parking areas during the school day. Once students arrive at school they are required to stay until their dismissal time. Doctors' appointments and the like should be scheduled outside of school hours whenever possible. Appointments that must be scheduled during the school day require an early dismissal pass. These are processed through the students' house offices, the procedures for which can be found in the Student Parent Handbook, included in this mailing. All visitors to our building are required to enter through the main entrance near the flag pole and to obtain a visitor's pass in the Main Office.

Dress Standards The goal of our dress standard is to foster an environment that is respectful, studious, and comfortable. Some modern fashion trends have made the atmosphere at school less than studious and respectful, and uncomfortable for some students and staff. In simple terms, we want girls' skirts and shorts to be of modest length (mid-thigh). Tops must have wide enough straps to cover undergarments, necklines that do not reveal excessive cleavage, and must be long enough to cover the midriff. Strapless tops are not permitted. Boys' pants must be worn high enough so that underwear is not visible. No clothing may have obscene, violent, vulgar, or sexually suggestive expressions, promote the use of drugs and/or alcohol, or bear the logo of alcohol or beer companies. Students who violate the established dress standards will be given the opportunity to immediately rectify the situation with other clothing but they will not be allowed to attend classes until they have done so.

**Reporting Bullying** The FWHS Student Parent Handbook (pgs. 8 & 9) provides details on the anti-bullying policies and the procedures for the reporting and investigation of behavior that may constitute bullying. Students and parents are reminded that there are boxes located in each house office, the Counseling Center (T-32) and the Nurses' Office for anonymous written reports to be submitted. In all instances we encourage students and parents to discuss all concerns with a member of the school staff.

Allergies There are students in our school who live with severe food allergies and we must take all possible precautions to assure that they are not exposed to unnecessary risks. There are also some students who have an allergy to latex. Latex balloons cannot be brought into the building Please note the "nut free" areas posted in the building. Please refer to the health alert information notice included in this mailing.

Summer Reading The Fairfield Warde High School Annual Summer Reading Program promotes reading for interest and enjoyment. We eagerly anticipate the school-wide book chats on September 18. Students are reminded to have their books read by the start of school. Instructions and additional information can be found on the Fairfield Public Schools website. In order to assure that the book chat groups are organized for the 18<sup>th</sup>, students must have informed us of the books they selected. Please see the FPS website if you have not already submitted your book choices.

Homeroom is an important time of day at FWHS. It is during this period that we pause to reflect on the day, to communicate information about school events and student accomplishments, and take school-wide attendance. Laxness regarding homeroom promptness and attendance has caused numerous problems for students regarding the attendance policy and often causes unnecessary anxiety in families when students are mistakenly marked absent simply because they missed homeroom.

Schedule Changes Much time and effort has gone into the development of the school's master schedule. Each year our goal is to offer an adequate number of sections of the courses requested and to place the classes at the time of day to allow the greatest number of students to actually fit them in their schedules. Therefore, we honor requests for changes only for the following reasons:

- Incomplete schedule or insufficient credits
- A course scheduled in error by the school
- A change in level of a course, approved by teacher and curriculum leader
- Changes needed as a result of courses failed or as a result of summer school work

Parking Students who plan to drive to school must register their vehicle, obtain a parking sticker and pay the fee of \$150.00. They will then be assigned a specific space. This process will be handled through the Dean's office in each house.

#### FWHS Open House – September 11 – 7:00 p.m.

Parents are cordially invited and strongly encouraged to attend our annual Open House to be held September 11<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 to 9:40 p.m. The program will begin in the auditorium with welcoming remarks and an overview of the school year by school administrators and PTA representatives. Parents will then follow their students' schedules, meet the faculty, and learn about course content and expectations in abbreviated class periods. Schedules and other information will be distributed in homerooms. Parents can avoid being late to first period if they know their students' homeroom before coming to school that evening.

In Case of Emergency To assure that all students have accurate and up-to-date emergency information on file, we require that new emergency cards are completed each year. Blank cards are included in this mailing. Students should submit the completed emergency cards to their homeroom teachers no later than September 10<sup>th</sup>. Also be sure that contact and demographic information is up to date on Infinite Campus. We will be using IC to contact families for school cancellations, delays and emergency notifications. Please contact our Main Office with any questions about Infinite Campus.

The faculty, staff, and administration look forward to welcoming everyone back on August 28th as we resume the "Battle Against Ignorance." We wish you a fun, safe, and relaxing remainder of the summer.
