

If this is your first trip, or your 10th, there is always something new to try at Disneyworld. Of course, there are all the amazing rides and shows. Here is a park by park list of some lesser known and often free things to try:

All Parks:

Get the itinerary at the beginning of the parks; it has the show time listings, as well as some character and attraction listings. Also, partake of the Fastpass system.

Autographs – you can get autographs from all the costumed characters at the park. You generally have to wait in line to see them/ have your picture taken with them, but you can Fastpass many of these. Also, check with the Chaperones. Some of us have Chase Visa Cards, and are entitled to special meet and greets at Epcot. You can also be completely weird and get autographs from just about any cast member in the park; Custodial staff, Shop Keepers, Greeters, fellow FWHS students, anyone. You can bring a book or paper from home for these, or buy an official Disneyworld Autograph book in the park. I recommend a nice spiral bound blank book (like a sketch book) and an acid free pen.



Stickers-Many Cast Members have Mickey stickers to give out, usually to children, but if you are an adult and want one you can request it.



Buttons-you can pick up a Disney button for celebrating a variety of milestones like getting engaged, just married, anniversary, Birthday, first visit, or get one of the buttons that simply says “Celebrating” and use the sharpie to fill in what your special celebration is. You can get a button at Guest Services, or most merchandise locations.



Disney PhotoPass Photographers will take your photo all over the resort and give you a card to see them online. You can choose to purchase them later, or not, but you still get to see them at no charge. The best freebie is you can have one of these trained photographers also take your photo with your camera, phone, or iPad.



Water-You can get a free cup of cold water from any of the counter-service restaurants in the park so there is no excuse for you to be dehydrated. There are also water fountains around to refill water bottles.



INGRESS – is a cell phone game where you choose a side (Blue or Green) and take over “portals.” This is not a Disneyworld game. It is owned and run by Google. Ask you parents before installing. This game can be played just about anywhere, including Fairfield. Rumor has it there are a great many portals in Disneyworld.

Pin Trading – For about \$30 you can buy a lanyard with 5-6 pins on it, and then look through the parks for Cast Members wearing lanyards or pin-pouches. They will trade up to 2 pins with you. Through trading, you can come home with pins you like for a cool souvenir.

Downtown Disney:

PLEASE remember we are a LARGE GROUP. Please don't over-use these. But partake and enjoy as the good and polite teenagers you can be.



Goofy's Candy Company: samples Goofy's Glaciers, which are flavorful ice-type drinks. You can choose from several different flavors to sample.

Goofy's Candy Company Continued: This shop has a huge variety of Disney packaged candy but the highlight is custom ordering your apple coverings to make a really special candy apple. Fresh candy and cookies are available for purchase.



Ghirardelli chocolate is handed out at their Downtown Disney location where you can buy special gift packs, or treat yourself to a non-complimentary, but incredibly delicious ice cream sundae made with famous Ghirardelli Hot Fudge. Mmmm.

Animal Kingdom:



FREE GAME - Animal Kingdom has an activity called Wilderness Explorer's where you enlist, and then as you visit through the park you will run into stations where you learn something new and earn a badge sticker to put in your WE Handbook that you take home with you. Begin this game as you cross over the bridge right in front of the giant tree.

Single rider line: Expedition Everest (roller coaster) has a single rider line. It moves faster than the regular line, and is a good option if you don't have a fastpass to this ride.

Hollywood Studios:



Animation Academy, Disney's Hollywood Studios, is a drawing class where you learn to draw a Disney character in twenty minutes. Easy step by step instructions are given and demonstrated at the front of the room. Guests sit at light desks and draw on large pieces of paper with Ticonderoga pencils, without erasers. One of the points they stress in the class is to draw lightly in the early sketching and then darken your lines after you have fleshed out the character. You get to take your drawing with you. Some of the artists do trivia questions that allow you the chance to win their drawing to take home. It is a very fun and informative attraction. The artists will give background information on the character they are teaching

Epcot:



Club Cool in Future World at Epcot gives us free cups of sodas from around the world. You can taste all of them, but watch out for Beverly! The location is sponsored by Coke and you can pick up frozen cokes and Coca-Cola memorabilia. It is loud and has a sticky floor but is worth the fun.



Kidcot Fun Spot-This is an activity for children traveling around World Showcase at Epcot. They can begin in any country and choose a Duffy the Bear or Perry the Platypus to color. When they visit the 11 Kidcot spots, one at each country, they can have it stamped by a Cast Member who will also write their name in that country's language. The cardboard images are attached to a wide stick making them *useful as fans* too. They let Teens and Grown-ups color too.



FREE GAME: Epcot / World Showcase offers the Agent P game where you join in with Perry, Phineas and Ferb to shut down Doofenshmirtz's evil plan. Look for the kiosks in between worlds. They look like empty apple carts with 1 or 2 cast members hanging out.

Passport to World Showcase – At several gift shops in Epcot, you can purchase a “Passport,” then as you visit each “Country” in the world showcase, you can get your “passport” stamped.

Single rider line: Test Track has a single rider line. It moves faster than the regular line, and is a good option if you don't have a fastpass to this ride.

Magic Kingdom:



Free samples at Main Street Confectionary at Magic Kingdom come in a variety of treats like Fudge or Caramel Apple pieces. The air in this shop is so sweet and it takes a strong will to walk through here and not sample or purchase at least one of the goodies they create. During the day you can watch confectionary cast members creating candy-covered apples, cotton candy, cake pops, crispy rice treats, and cookies, just to name a few



FREE GAMES: Magic Kingdom offers two games: **Sorcerer's of the Magic Kingdom** - Upon entering Magic Kingdom each day you can pick up a new set of playing cards at the Firehouse and use them to fight virtual villains around the park. The cards are free, one set per day. **Pirate's Adventure** - In Adventureland you can join up with the likes of Captain Jack Sparrow using a series of maps to gain control of the seven seas

DoleWhip is at its core, fruit flavored ice cream. The ice cream comes in Orange, Vanilla and Pineapple. You can then get it in a float with Orange juice or Pineapple Juice. This treat is amazingly refreshing and located just outside of the Jungle Cruise at the entrance of Adventure Land.
