STUDENT VOLUNTARY ACCIDENT INSURANCE 2018-2019

PLAN A - SCHOOL TIME ONLY PLAN

This insurance coverage is for the hours and days when school is in session and while attending school sponsored and supervised activities.

PLAN B - 24-HOUR ACCIDENT COVERAGE

This insurance coverage is valid 24 hours a day.

- Any covered activity
- 24 hours a day, including summer
- Covers weekends and vacation periods
- Protection at home or while away
