Absence Reporting

Student Activity Period – New Time

Activity period will occur two Wednesdays a month <u>from 7:30</u> <u>a.m. to 7:50 a.m.</u> All of the activity dates are listed on the school calendar, which is accessible on the school website.

Safety and Security

We continue to make improvements in our school protocols and physical plant. All visitors to our building are required to enter through the main entrance near the flagpole, stop at the security desk to show identification, and sign in. We ask that all students work with us in maintaining our safe environment. Do not open outside doors for anyone, politely direct them to the Main Office entrance. Students must present an ID to the security guard at the front entrance if they are arriving after our entrance doors have been closed.

Entrances

There will be three entrances to our school in the morning: Main Entrance, Bus Loop Entrance, and Rear Townsend Entrance. All other doors will be locked.

Campus and School Grounds Regulations

We want our students to take full advantage of the many resources for learning and to remain safe throughout the school day. Fairfield Warde High School is a <u>closed campus</u>.

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In addition, students are not permitted to leave school grounds or to be in the parking areas during the school day. Once students arrive at school they are required to stay until their dismissal time. Appointments that must be scheduled during the school day require an early dismissal pass.

Parking

Students who plan to drive to school must register their vehicle, obtain a parking sticker and pay the fee of \$150.00. They will then be assigned a specific space. This process will be handled through the Dean's office in each house. All obligations <u>must</u> be paid before purchasing a parking permit.

Traffic Patterns

The Fairfield Police Department and town engineering department help to determine the traffic patterns for our school. The drop off location for student is located in the circle near the front entrance of FWHS by the flag pole. Access to this area is from Melville Avenue. Parents dropping off should pull as far as possible into the circle before stopping to drop off students. Only faculty/staff should be using the back entrance behind Fitts House on Melville Avenue. Students driving to school should use one of the two Knapps Highway entrances to the student parking lots. All drivers are advised to comply with the established traffic pattern and regulations for the safety of pedestrians and drivers on and around school grounds. Please do not use the back entrance to drop off students. Students should also be picked up in the front of the building. Police will be taking enforcement action on violations such as speeding and/or reckless driving on and around school property.
