## FAIRFIELD WOODS MIDDLE SCHOOL AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITY PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS 2017-2018

Please note: If your child is signing up for a sports activity, you will need to "register" them for Intramural Sports:

- Go the FWMS web site, click on intramural sports (blue link on the right side of the web site page and follow directions.
- A letter is automatically generated that is sent to FWMS and your child is then eligible for any and all FWMS after school physical activities for the school year.

Changes, cancellations, and new club additions are announced on an ongoing basis. Students can check on the activity bulletin board in the cafeteria for updates.

- BASKETBALL TEAM BOYS Varsity. The team carries approximately 15 players. Tryouts are held early November and the team practices every weekday. League play is from December through January.
- BASKETBALL TEAM GIRLS Varsity. The teams carry a total of 15 players selected during a November "clinic/tryout" on 11/1 3:00 - 4:30p.m. and 11/2 3:00 - 4:00p.m. Basic skills are stressed. The team practices Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and some Fridays. League play is from December through the first week of February.
