## SBA Math Word of the Day!

To help boost our students' understanding of math vocabulary, we will be announcing a *Math Word of the Day* each morning on the Holland Hill morning announcements. Classroom teachers will post the word and the definition and will have a quick discussion about the word. Some of the words will be a first exposure for our younger students, but it's never too early to

introduce our students to math vocabulary they will encounter in the future.

Below are the words in the order they will be announced. This would be a great opportunity for you, as a parent, to have a conversation with your child about math. Ask your child if they know what the word means and what they can tell you about the word. Some words may be more challenging than others, depending on the age of your child, so use your judgement as to which words you would like to discuss!

Week 1: array, polygon, meter, multiple, addend

**Week 2**: sum, difference, quadrilateral, factor, expression

**Week 3**: fraction, denominator, numerator, parallelogram

**Week 4**: equivalent, true, equation, product, line segment


**Week 5:** angle, parallel lines, quotient, area, perimeter

**Week 6:** right angle, acute angle, obtuse angle, liter, line of symmetry

Week 7: decimal, mixed number, minute, hour, centimeter

**Week 8:** octagon, gram, kilogram improper fraction, ordered pairs

### **SRBI~A Continuing Process**

You may remember a lot of information coming home in the beginning of the year about the revamped **SRBI** (*Scientifically Research Based Intervention*) process that is in place throughout schools in Fairfield. Simply put, this is the way schools analyze student growth, and then plan instruction which is targeted to each student's needs.

This is the time of the school year in which parents begin to think about next year, and sometimes anxiety about that transition might make you worry about your child's progress. Please know that we are continually reviewing the progress of ALL students in regularly scheduled meetings involving teachers, administrators and curriculum specialists. The many assessments your children participates in are reviewed and analyzed as part of that process.
