## Jennings Goes "Global"

Our 4th and 5th grade students are participating in the Global Read Aloud of the book "The Fourteenth Golfish" by Jennifer Holm. While all 5th graders are being read the book by Mrs. Rooney, the 4th graders are participating in a group read aloud in the Library Learning Commons.

We are posting questions and responses regarding the book using Padlet, a free, online tool that functions like a piece of paper on the Web. Padlet offers a "virtual wall" for students to ask questions, discuss, and summarize. Each post has 150 characters and all posts on our Padlet wall are monitored and submitted for approval. Posting a question or response does not require a log in username and password and we do encourage participants to post their location (state and country) in order to get a feel of the globalization part implied by this project. We do not require anyone to use their full name. First name only, or just initials.
