Last week Mr. Hyder and Mrs. Ruppert presented at the PTA general meeting regarding standardized assessments. Two of the assessments will begin soon. During the next couple of weeks the students in grades K-5 will begin taking I Ready math and grade 3-5 will begin taking STAR reading. The assessments will be taken on the computer and will be used to assist our staff in supporting the learning of all the students. The data collected, along with daily performance and curriculum based measures, will allow the teachers to target the instruction each student needs in both whole group and small group instruction. It will also allow individualized support to be strategically planned based upon what the relative areas of strength and focus are.
