Health

Before vacation, your child brought home Scrubby Bear's Handwashing chart. We asked that your child track his/her handwashing for the entire month of December. Math

Our students are continuing to investigate and gain a deeper understanding of equivalence. Students are also working on the idea that numbers can be grouped in a variety of ways or presented in a different order, and the quantity will stay the same. We have been exploring these ideas by studying a book called The Double-Decker Bus - bus that has two decks with ten seats on each. Five seats on each deck are red and five seats are white. The bus goes by quickly and the little girl in the story, sitting at her bedroom window and watching, works out ways to use the color of seats to calculate quickly how many people are on the bus. Her father drives a double-decker bus and she helps him figure out a way to know how many empty seats there are on the top deck even though he cannot see them.
