Reading Workshop


Last week we talked about how books feel when we read them. Sometimes they feel too easy when you know all the words by heart. They may feel too hard when you have to use your strategies to figure out every single word. Books should feel just right! These books require the kids to use strategies to figure out some tricky words, but they feel successful when they are able to do it!

All First Graders now have their own reading bins filled with "just-right" books that they personally shopped for last week. During private and partner reading, students will practice reading these books by themselves or with a partner.

Writing Workshop

Last week we worked on teaching the students to write about one small time instead of writing "about everything" stories. We learned that sometimes we have been writing about big giant topics like school, vacation or friends. We call these "watermelon topics' because they are so big. They are so big, in fact, that just as they are hard to carry, they are hard to write! We now know that writers write about teen tiny 'seed ideas' - little stories inside the one big topic. We also learned that inside a watermelon topic there are a zillion teeny seed stories. Here's our brainstorming session where we were trying to zoom the big watermelon topic of School into many different seed ideas!

Instead of writing about big watermelon topics, writers write about teeny tiny seed ideas.



<u>Math Workshop</u>

Last week we worked on various classroom investigations where the kids investigated the idea of doubles. Please help reinforce double facts at home with your children (1+1=2, 2+2=4, 3+3=6).
