#### Word Wall Words

We will also have a test on Friday which will also include last week's words (from, did, eat, teacher, kick).

\*\*\*Your child should be able to read and write each word wall word in a snap. Please continue to practice all introduced words. Mrs. P adds all of the weekly words onto Spelling City, so you may want to give it a try!

### Reading and Writing

This week we are finishing our Poetry Units. This week we will be focusing on reading poetry with appropriate fluency by using punctuation, line breaks, white space, and other aspects of the way a poem looks.

#### Math

We are continuing to study place value. The purpose of this unit is to develop students' understanding of place value. Using a series of investigations students will gather data and study patterns in our place value system to deepen their understanding of place value concepts. Students will understand that a digit can represent ones or tens or hundreds, depending on where it is placed and will compare two- digit numbers. Students will see that place value patterns occur when making and adding groups of ten. They will also understand that groupings of ones,

tens, and hundreds can be composed (put together) and decomposed (taken apart) in different ways.

## Here are some things you can continue to practice at home:

\* 10 more/10 less

\*breaking number apart in flexible ways. Here are some ways to build 34:

$$30 + 4 = 34$$

$$10 + 10 + 10 + 4 = 34$$

$$20 + 10 + 4 = 34$$

$$5 + 5 + 5 + 5 + 5 + 5 + 4 = 34$$

\*counting by 10s from any given number. (Example: 7, 17, 27, 37, 47...)

#### Science

We are continuing our research in the library with Mrs. P. The students are using PebbleGo and library books to learn all about the animals.
