



 - Kindergarten social skills instruction






School Improvement Plan Indicators of Progress


- Reading Goal: 85% of students meet/exceed GLE

- Math Goal: 29 37 point growth in iReady scores
- ELL Proficiency will improve 10%/year
- Number of students receiving intervention from a specialist will decline by 20%/year




Indicators of Progress

- Observations show evidence of continuous improvement






- Strengthen teacher leadership capacity


