add to our curriculum. Essentially, these components will aid teachers in developing student agency and encourage children to challenge their mathematical thinking.

And, yes, we do have state testing. While I understand that SBA testing is a measure that receives much public attention, it is just one measure. However, it is a measure that is comprehensive and rigorous and worthy of our attention. Yet, it is not something that we should quickly and easily draw conclusions from. Rather, we should use it as a very integral data point for such purposes as:

- provide feedback to students, staff, and parents
- inform instructional practices
- encourage reflection and adjustment for the whole school, grade levels, classrooms,
 and individual students

There is certainly plenty for me to talk to you about in terms of programs, initiatives, and curriculum and I could go on and on, but let's face it, all you're hearing right now is the teacher from the Peanuts. Wa, wa, wa wa wa. What I really want to convey is how I feel about this job and how these people feel about theirs. The other district administrators and I met over the summer and we had the pleasure of meeting our Interim Superintendent, Dr. Tracy. Then, most recently, I had the pleasure of meeting our newly appointed Superintendent, Dr. Jones. I need to let you all know that they both seem to be very genuine and caring educators who use the "F" word. No, not that "F" word! FUN! (you woke back up on that one) They emphasized the importance of having children love school, which is so refreshing. I love what I do, and I know these folks do as well. And I love that I am so fortunate to work here in this community that is so supportive of education. I take great pride in trying to create and sustain an environment that is safe, comfortable, and, yes, fun. If we can accomplish that, then our children will learn.
