The Task:

You will need to take a virtual tour of our state to discover its many symbols and places of interest. You will work independently to research several Connecticut attractions and take your notes in a WebQuest Journal. You will discover:

- Symbols of our state
- Our borders (Hint: we're a small state!)
- Our capital city and what important work happens there
- Where your family can go to learn and have fun

As an expert on Connecticut, you will create a rationale for your vacation. Then, as a class, you will create a mural of Connecticut showing all the places about which you have written. The murals will be exhibited in the main hallways at Osborn and will be open to the public during school hours.

The Process: 1. Start your virtual tour of Connecticut by clicking below to see a chart of Connecticut symbols. You might want to share your new knowledge with your family!

- draw them in the three boxes in the journal (with notes about what you've read, of course!)
