

American Education Week History

Distressed that 25 percent of the country's World War I draftees were illiterate and 29 percent were physically unfit, representatives of the National Education Association and the American Legion met in 1919 to seek ways to generate public support for education.

The governing body conventions of both organizations subsequently adopted resolutions of support for a national effort to raise public awareness of the importance of education. In 1921, the NEA Representative Assembly in Des Moines, lowa called for designation of one week each year to spotlight education. In its resolution, the NEA called for:


An educational week...observed in all communities annually for the purpose of informing the public of the accomplishments and needs of the public schools and to secure the cooperation and support of the public in meeting those needs.

The first observance of American Education Week occurred December 4-10, 1921, with the NEA and American Legion as the co-sponsors. A year later, the then U.S. Office of Education joined the effort as a co-sponsor, and the PTA followed in 1938.

In the earliest observances, there was a different theme for each day of American Education Week. But in 1929 this practice changed as representatives of the sponsoring groups came together to select a single theme, reflecting a current national concern.

Today, the week's co-sponsors are the U.S. Department of Education and 12 national organizations.

American Education Week is always the week prior to the week of Thanksgiving. The dates in 2013, therefore, are November 18 to 22.
