
The Little Ships: The Heroic Rescue at Dunkirk in World War II *by Louise Borden*

The Librarian of Basra: A True Story from Iraq by Jeanette Winter

Alia Muhammad Baker is a librarian in Basra, Iraq. For fourteen years, the library where she works has been a meeting place for those who love books. Now war has come, and Alia fears that the library will be destroyed forever. 
BIOGRAPHY

Grandfather's Journey by Allen Say

A Japanese American man recounts his grandfather's journey to America which he also undertakes later, and the feelings of being torn by a love for two different countries. | Lexile: 560

Knights of the Kitchen Table

by Jon Scieszka

Joe receives a magic book for his birthday present from his uncle. Joe, Fred, and Sam are transported to a time when evil knights, fire-breathing dragons, and vilesmelling giants roamed the land. | Lexile: 630
