

Class Placements

Please make note that placements are final, as the teachers have already begun preparing for the start of the school year. It is also important to note that a great deal of thought, time and effort was dedicated to balancing the groups in every grade level back in June to allow every student to be able to appropriately access the curriculum and be able to function as reasonably independently as possible and comparable to his/her peer group. This means that the discussions that you may have had with last year's teachers and/or Mrs. Roxbee will have been honored during those placement meetings to maximum extent possible, which occurred long before I took the helm. Thus, I feel confident that the teams when organizing the placements did so using all of the necessary information and insight available to them and to the maximum extent possible.
