#### Beyond Grit & Perseverance...Kindness & Compassion

Recently at our town meeting, we introduced Kindness and Compassion (K&C) as our current focus traits. We will of course continue emphasizing the practice and recognition of Grit and Perseverance (G&P), but we also now wish to emphasize and spotlight being kind and compassionate. Similar to the way we have recognized G&P, we want the adults in our building to acknowledge when they see others (students and adults) demonstrating K&C, and when they do, they will present the student with a colorful heart, which will then be placed on a large brown paper tree we have taped to the wall in the main foyer (courtesy of Mrs. Kopchik, Mrs. Goldberg and Miss Ciarletto) next to the mural. Our hope is to watch this tree bloom with K&C up to and beyond the holiday period, and with a view to supporting and encouraging us all to practice these traits free of the motivation to acquire recognition or reward, and rather to simply do what's right because it's the right thing to do.

When we introduced these focus traits at the town meeting, we showed the students videos that exemplified K&C, and we had a few first, second and fifth grade students share their perspective on and stories of K&C. #### From Anna Soja Mulhall (parent). This program was approved by PTA

Hello, I am happy to share we are reintroducing the Crayola ColorCycle recycling program to Sherman School. Students and staff can help to keep plastic out of landfills. Collect markers from **classrooms/office** and bring in from **home** any used **markers** that are ready to be discarded. *They can be any brand of marker, highlighter or dry erase, markers and/or caps.* Rather than throwing them in the trash and into landfills, they can be deposited into the **ColorCycle** boxes we have located in the **Art Room** as well as outside the **Library** doors. The markers we collect and keep out of landfills will be sent back to Crayola - free of charge. The tip and reservoir will be removed and the plastic marker barrel will be recycled and repurposed into something else ! How cool is that ? ! So let's start recycling those markers Sherman Community!

This program starts today and there is no deadline. We will collect and recycle markers through this program throughout the school year. The Mulhall family - Michael 3H, Max 3M and Maggie 1D will be responsible for shipping them to Crayola ColorCycle.

It may be helpful to set up a recycle bin in your classroom/workspace that gets deposited into the central box locations periodically. Do whatever works best for you. It would be greatly appreciated if teachers allow students to bring markers from home to the ColorCycle boxes during the school day. Perhaps when they are on their way to Art/Library for minimal class disruption.
